The researcher is usually someone who has completed a substantial body of work (e.g. MD/PhD) and should not be in a Consultant / Senior Lecturer post or equivalent (although where the body of work was completed prior to recent appointment they will be considered).

The award process allows a number of finalists to achieve recognition through formal presentation at the ICS State of the Art meeting in front of their peers.

The award is open to members and non-members. A maximum of 5 abstracts will be shortlisted for the Gold medal oral

presentation.
